FIA ACHIEVEMENTS FY23

- •<u>SNAP</u>- An average of 101,630 individuals were served each month and \$163M in benefits issued.
- •<u>Summer SNAP</u> The Governor increased the funding for Summer SNAP in FY'22. Thanks to the County's \$250,000 matching contribution, the Department was able to serve a total of 10,833 Prince George's County children; a 94% increase from prior years.
- •PA2E- The Public Assistance to Entrepreneurship program continues to flourish. The program was administered in partnership with the Department of Human Services and the Small Business Development Centers. This program provides entrepreneurship training for SNAP customers who have ideas, talent, and are in pursuit of their entrepreneurial dreams of starting a small business while supporting their families. In February 2023, nine Prince George's County businesses received up to \$10,000 each in startup funds through Capital Grant funds for their businesses.
- •<u>TCA</u>- An average of 2,545 families (2,238 adults and 4,586 children) were served each month and a total of \$11.5M in benefits issued.



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FIA ACHIEVEMENTS FY23

- <u>TDAP</u>- An average of 592 individuals received the TDAP benefit each month and \$1.3M in benefits have been issued.
- <u>PAA</u>- The Department served an average of 281 households each month and issued \$196,167.88 in financial assistance.
- •EAFC- With the expiration of the eviction moratorium, many families in the county were facing eviction. In addition, the amount owed to prevent eviction was significantly higher than normal. As a result, we saw an unprecedented increase in the number of families needing EAFC assistance to resolve their eviction. To date, the Department has assisted 298 families in resolving their evictions and issued a total of \$899,389 in financial assistance.
- •ACA- The FY'23 open enrollment ran from November 1, 2022 through January 15, 2023. As of December 2022, Prince George's Health Connect achieved a total of 221,381 cumulative enrollment in Medicaid and 21,200 in Qualified Health Plan (QHP); the most in the state. This means that more county residents have access to the care they need, resulting in better health care outcomes, lower death rates, and averting being bankrupt by high and/or unanticipated medical expenses.



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
